

BIOGRAPHY: Luoluo Hong

The daughter of Chinese immigrants, Luoluo (pronounced "low-low") received her BA in Psychology from Amherst College in 1990, a Master's of Public Health from Yale University in 1992, and a PhD in Educational Leadership & Research from Louisiana State University in Baton Rouge in 1998. She has served in progressively responsible student affairs administrative positions over the past 16 years, with the most recent seven years leading at the Assistant Vice President and/or Dean level. Prior to arriving at Arizona State University, institutions where Luoluo worked included LSU (1992-2000); Shepherd University in West Virginia (2000-2002); and the University of Wisconsin-Madison (2002-2005). She began her tenure with ASU on August 1st, 2005, as

Dean of Student Affairs at the West campus and Clinical Associate Professor in Criminology & Criminal Justice. This past August, Luoluo left administration to become a full time faculty member; she is now Associate Professor of Women's Studies & Director of the Women's Resource Center at ASU's West campus.

In nearly 2,000 presentations Luoluo has addressed both student and professional audiences on campuses all over the country, as well as keynoted numerous state, regional and national conferences. A published author, her scholarship and writing have focused on issues related to cross-cultural communication, higher education leadership, women's health promotion, and the role of gender in violence prevention. She is best known in the student affairs profession for her innovative work with LSU's Men Against Violence – the first organization of its kind and scope in the US. A past member of the American College Health Association's Board of Directors, Luoluo now is a consulting editor for the Journal of American College Health, sits on the Advisory Board for the National Association of Student Personnel Administrators' Center for Scholarship, Research & Professional Development for Women, and is National Chair of the American College Personnel Association's Commission for Social Justice Educators.

An alumna member of the Delta Kappa chapter of Kappa Alpha Theta, Luoluo has volunteered with numerous rape crisis centers across the country and now serves on the Board of Directors for Casa – Center for Prevention of Abuse & Violence in Phoenix. She has spent her lifetime dedicated to advancing education, health and social justice. She currently resides in Avondale, AZ, with her spouse (who is a social worker), a cocker spaniel, and four cats. Her hobbies include collecting Painted Ponies, dancing, paper crafting, playing piano, watching movies, and PC gaming. She is a huge fan of Civilization IV, The Sims 2, World of Warcraft, Lord of the Rings, Harry Potter, and authors Maya Angelou, Patricia Cornwell, Terry Goodkind and John Grisham.
